SPECIAL ISSUE: GEOMORPHOLOGY OF LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN

We are intending to publish a special issue on diverse aspects of the Geomorphology in Latin America and the Caribbean in the **Boletín de la Sociedad Geológica Mexicana** (BSGM, <http://boletinsgm.igeolcu.unam.mx/bsgm/>). The BSGM is a completely free access semi-annual journal, **the oldest strictly peer-reviewed journal on Earth Sciences in Mexico and one of the oldest in Latin America**, and is included in the Web of Science, Journal Citation Reports, SciELO, Scopus, and in many other instruments.

Contributions related to both basic and applied Geomorphology are expected, including aspects such as the assessment of geomorphological hazards, their applications in land management and territorial planning, Geodiversity and Geoconservation issues, morphotectonics, among others, from Latin America and the Caribbean. Both original research articles and original thematic reviews are welcome, in the form of full-length articles as well as short notes for the communication of scientifically relevant news. Original contributions are expected from both the academic and private sectors.

Contributions can be written in either English or Spanish, including the abstract in both languages, and must adhere to our author guidelines (<http://boletinsgm.igeolcu.unam.mx/bsgm/index.php/instrucciones-instrucciones>). We apply **no restrictions** with regard to number of pages, number of figures or tables (other than those determined by our valued scientific reviewers and provided that they are meaningful additions), and **we do not charge** for coloured figures or for any other matter.

First, we need to have a precise idea of how many contributions can be effectively expected for this call for papers; therefore, we need the interested contributors to kindly provide a tentative title, a list of authors (with their institution names and contact emails), and a 300-word synopsis of their intended contributions.

Important dates:

- **August 31, 2024:** deadline for submission of tentative title, author list and synopsis.
- **November 30, 2024:** deadline for submission of original manuscripts
- **February 28, 2025:** deadline for all revisions by peers of submitted manuscripts.
- **May 31, 2025:** deadline for submission of revised manuscripts.
- **August 31, 2025:** deadline for online publication of all accepted contributions.

The dates above are only tentative and may be corrected depending on the amount of contributions to this issue. Any changes in schedule will be notified to all contributors as soon as necessary.

Note: It is recommended that manuscripts in English have been reviewed by a native English speaker. Papers with poor language usage may be subject to direct rejection.
